Kittens, Kittens Everywhere!

As always, love was in the air this spring. It goes without saying that the free roaming cats in our area couldn't help but celebrate. As you might expect that led to a prolific kitten season. Each year we do our best to save as many of these kittens as possible. This year we have rescued over 45 and they have truly graced our cattery. These little ones have provided us with many challenges and lots of entertainment.

Our first kittens were delivered by Aura, a one year old calico, that gave birth to 6 gorgeous kits (Cocoa Puff, Cookie Crisp, Kix, Pebbles, Honey Bunches, and Cheerio) just 10 days after arriving at the shelter. Fortunately, one of our fabulous volunteers offered to foster her through the birth and ensuing weeks until these little ones opened their eyes. Three of Aura's kittens have been adopted, but - Cocoa Puff, Cookie Crisp, and Kix -are still available and would love to share your life!

Aura's kittens were just the beginning, within a few weeks we were inundated with tiny future mousers. It was our good fortune that another volunteer graciously offer to foster a second litter in need of extra care.

As adoptions occurred, others were rescued. At one point 25 kittens were racing around our kitten room with unabashed joy. While many are already living the dream in their new forever home, there are plenty still looking for a life time lap in which to cuddle. Please come meet these furry balls of fluff and all the cats we have roaming around the cattery. Surely one will steal your heart. Thanks to your support, we continue to treat animals with heartworms, mange and other medical issues and give them a chance to find their forever homes. The stories of a couple of these special pets are shared below:



Sparky, is a one year old pug/beagle mix that came to the shelter in April. He had been rescued by Galveston Animal Control with an imbedded collar. This little fellow had been seen running free for over two months, but kept alluding the officers. Knowing he needed help, for the collar was imbedded 3/4ths of the way around his neck, they diligently pursued him and finally caught him. They arranged surgery for the collar's removal and when we heard about his situation, we brought

him to the shelter to recover. His story didn't end there, for he was heartworm positive. After the incision healed, he underwent heartworm treatment. The resilience of this little guy was amazing. Through all of his challenges he was cheerful and loving. Though a bit shy upon first meeting people, he quickly opened up his heart to their warmth. He

was adopted by a great family, but their cat was very hostile toward him, so they brought him back for his own safety. Sparky patiently waited for the right home, sharing his love with the staff and volunteers. We are happy to share that Sparky found a forever home with plenty of kids, a cat (who is just fine with having a dog in the family), and lots of love!





When Tippy came to the shelter she was a young puppy and things were not good. She was hairless and covered in scabs. Poor Tippy had one of the worst cases of mange the shelter staff had ever seen. It was hard to tell if she was a chihuahua or a hairless terrier. She loves to tell her

shelter story so here is the rest of her story in her words: "No hiding the truth, I was ugly. The staff was pretty awesome and cheered me up telling me I would be a beauty one day. Day after day I looked in the mirror, but still no hair. Then one day I noticed peach fuzz covering my skin. The shelter staff said it was super soft and loved to rub it. Week after week I patiently waited for it to grow and now I have a full coat. Best of all, as my coat grew that horrible itching went away and I began to enjoy life. Now that I feel better, I am a very playful gal. I approach

everything I do with enthusiasm. Life was meant to be enjoyed and I want to enjoy every minute of the day. Whether it is racing around, playing with other dogs, or just being adventuresome, I'm in. After 11 months, Mocha found her furever family and this is her Happy Tail:

I'm so thankful to have her in my life, I love just puttering around and taiking to her, she has everything she could ever want, but the thing she has the most is LOVE and safety. She is house broken, she doesn't bark, she is calm and easy, she loves rubbing and even did great with her bath!
